YOUR CAREER STARTS HERE...

High school students attend Green Country three hours each day. During the remaining portion of the day, students are scheduled at their home high schools. High school students attend tuition free and each year receive three to four credits toward high school graduation upon successful completion.

CARPENTRY

Provide yourself actual work experience on construction projects that involve the use of metal, masonry and wood. Safe and appropriate use of hand and power tools is taught. The program is designed to train students to become skilled and competitive construction workers.

CNC-MANUFACTURING TECHNOLOGY

Machinists are skilled workers who are able to make all types of machined parts. Learn to set up and operate basic machine tools, read blueprints and learn use of metal working hand tools and precision measuring instruments.

DIGITAL MEDIA

Students learn a variety of skills used in the graphic design and film industry. They will be able to produce sophisticated graphics for the web and for print., as well as video production, including script writing, filming, video editing and authoring.

COMPUTER AIDED DRAFTING

Prepare yourself for an exciting drafting and design career. You will begin with basic drawing theory and techniques before moving into advanced CAD skills, utilizing state-of-the-art computers and software programs.

HEALTH CAREER CERTIFICATION

Prepare yourself for exciting career opportunities in health-related fields. The courses have been created in cooperation with medical professionals, and feature actual clinical experience. Students learn basic knowledge and skills necessary for entry-level employment in the medical field. First year students will receive certifications in CPR, First Aid and CNA.

MECHANICAL TRADES

Training in basic welding for home, shop repair and professional level welding. The basics of small engine repair will teach students the parts, how to disassemble and reassemble the small engine. Students also learn to troubleshoot.

PRE-NURSING

Pre-nursing allows second year students to explore a specialty field and gain clinical experience in it. Students complete prerequisites necessary for admission into the GTC Practical Nursing Program. Upon acceptance the student does not have to retake the approved sections.

WEB DESIGN

Students have the opportunity to become a successful web designer, web developer or flash developer. They will learn fundamental skills in XHTML and CSS. Students are encouraged to create, using Dreamweaver, Fireworks, Flash and Photoshop software .

In addition, students will work with 3D animation software that will enable them to create 3D images and animations for web sites.

ADULT FULL-TIME PROGRAMS

BOOT MAKING

Students learn the techniques for pattern making, boot design, foot measuring and boot construction. Instruction on design variation include inlays, overlays, wing tips, toe caps and foxing.

SADDLE MAKING

Students learn pattern making and design of western saddles and tack. Repair techniques including, relining, restringing, replacing/repairing broken parts and hardware are part of the curriculum.

PRACTICAL NURSING

Looking for a recession proof career? Enroll in the Practical Nursing program and become a member of the healthcare team. The Practical Nursing program integrates theory with hands-on experience. Graduates of the program are eligible to take the national licensure exam.
